Owner's children compete in show jumping and bring on animals for clients and Drumbaragh Stables has 18 stables and has a floodlit arena, it was built during the storm Beast from the East. Craig Anderson built the newer



side of the yard while the old form buildings were adapted to suit the horses, and these have been around since the 1800's so it adds a little character to the yard. There are 22 horse's that lie in Drumbaragh in both the stables and the 30 acers surrounding the yard. A legend of Drumbaragh is share a very important old pony who is estimated to be in his forties. And has been ridden by all the family, he also has taught many kids to ride. There is a selection of schooling ponies that are ready to teach kids to ride and also teach them how to look after them.
