### 2024: Looking back on the very recent past

A key exhibition in our 2024 programme involved looking back just four years ago in 'Creative Reflections on 2020'. The exhibition included sculptures and photography by Cheryl Brown, Philip Lauterbach and Anthony Scott, charting their three different responses to the covid-19 lockdown. Also on show were a series of photographs of Enniskillen in 2020 by Frank Britton, and a collection of drawings by NHS staff.

Museums reflect and collect the present for future generations, as well as preserving the past from centuries ago. One of the items accessioned into our collections in 2024 was a bottle of hand sanitiser made locally by the Boatyard Distillery on 6 April 2020.

#### Looking back on 140 years

"Distilling the Decades. The Blake Family Archive" was a wonderfully engaging exhibition tracing back over 140 years, starting in 1880 with a grocer's shop on Chapel Street, Derrylin, up to the Blake's businesses today.

The exhibition was a compelling exploration of a family's enduring legacy and its impact on the local community and beyond. The evolution of the family business was told through the display of several hundred documents, photographs and memorabilia, many of which had been lovingly preserved by previous generations in shoeboxes, under beds and on top of wardrobes.

These were displayed alongside examples from the recently donated archive of the artist's books, catalogues and art materials as well as the actual domestic objects represented in his painting. The inspirational archive was the extraordinary gift of the Estate of William Scott to Fermanagh. The "William Scott (1913-1989): From Life to Art" exhibition was also visited by

artist's nephew, Cardwell McClure. Cardwell further extended the archive by generously giving the Museum his extensive research material from his publication, "William Scott. A Family History".









# Our collections are acquired, kept safe and explained through your support


In 2024, 307 artefacts were accessioned into our collections. Artefacts were given mainly through the generosity of individuals and Friends of Fermanagh County Museum. Material donated included a substantial collection of sheet music by celebrated songwriter James (Jimmy) Kennedy (1902-1984). Kennedy, originally from Omagh, Co. Tyrone, who famously wrote the words to the existing music for the "Teddy Bears' Picnic". The collection was kindly donated to Fermanagh & Omagh District Council by J.J. Tohill. The collection relates to the Museum's collecting scope to acquire and preserve artefacts relating to County Tyrone in addition to County Fermanagh. Our current collecting priorities can be seen online as part of the Collections Management Framework. The Jimmy Kennedy collection is accessible online as a theme, part of the growing digital access to our museum holdings. Another donation received was a collection of aerial views of Enniskillen taken by Colm McGuinness between 1991 to 1996 when the refurbishment of St Michael's Church was taking place. The photographs were donated to our collections via Frankie Roofe.

#### In summary...

In 2024, 90,661 people visited Enniskillen Castle; 6 exhibitions were opened; 5 talks were held; 7 trails were offered; 11 additional events organised; 24 public events hosted; 307 objects, documents & photographs were accessioned into our collections; 6,588 school children, students and adults participated in our education and outreach programmes.
